

California – Data Privacy Notice - Online

This California Data Privacy Notice ("Notice") is provided on behalf of Wood Mackenzie, Inc. (hereinafter "we" "our" or "us") and applies to consumers (hereinafter, "you" or "your") of California. This notice applies to personal data we collect on www.woodmac.com or any Wood Mackenzie-branded website.

Personal Information We Collect

We collect information that identifies, relates to, describes, references, is capable of being associated with, or could reasonably be linked, directly or indirectly, with a consumer. - To perform auditing related to a current interaction with you and concurrent transactions, including, but not limited to, counting ad impressions, verifying positioning and quality of ad impressions, and auditing compliance with this specification and other standards
- To detect security incidents
- To resist and protect against malicious, deceptive, fraudulent, or illegal activity
- To identify and repair errors that impair existing intended website functionality
- To perform services on behalf of, or for, clients or service providers, including maintaining or servicing accounts, providing customer service, processing or fulfilling orders and transactions, verifying customer information, processing payments, providing advertising or marketing services, providing analytic services, or providing similar services on behalf of clients or service providers

Selling or Sharing of personal information

"Sharing" means sharing, renting, releasing, disclosing, disseminating, making available, transferring, or otherwise communicating orally, in writing, or by electronic or other means, a consumer's personal information to a third party for cross-context behavioural advertising.

We do not sell or share consumers' personal information.
